About the Speakers 講者簡介

Mr Marek Jankowski graduated with honors in marketing information management at the Wroclaw University of Economics, Poland and completed postgraduate studies in the field of SMEs financial management. He worked as a radio journalist for 8 years and then started his own company. It was a first child development centre in Poland, where parents with 6 months and older babies could have come and play educational games in small groups led by pedagogues. In 2008 he started to publish Branza Dziecieca, which is now the leading Polish business-to-business magazine covering toys and baby care products sector. In 2011 Mr Jankowski was elected for a Board Member of Polish Toy Association. He is an author of two books: "Little Big Company" (2008) and "Traps of Small Business" (2011).



Mr Michael Wüst is Technical Manager for mechanical products of the Intertek Global Hardline team, and is responsible for the product safety certification of mechanical products for the German market.

He is a certified Toolmaker and has degrees in Mechanical Engineering and apprentice teaching & training. For Intertek he has been instrumental in the successful development of the mechanical Consumer Product Safety Certification system in Asia for the German GS-mark, and has planned and set-up the mechanical testing laboratory in Wiesbaden, Germany in mid 2002. He has further been actively involved in the planning and set-up of new laboratories in Vietnam and Indonesia, as well as the new mechanical laboratory in Shanghai / China.



Dr Med Michael Andreas Kandler graduated in human medicine at the University of Erlangen-Nuernberg, Germany; his habilitation in paediatrics followed during his work for the intensive care unit of the university clinic. Dr. Kandler specialized on paediatric pulmonology, neonatology and emergency medicine. He was head of a clinical research group for years. At present he works in his own private practice and as lecturer at the University of Erlangen-Nuernberg. In his work as an emergency physician Dr. Kandler has gained experience of the consequences of fatal use of toys or dangerous product design. He has developed a sensitive approach on baby and children's products that can lead to severe injuries or even the death of a child. He advises companies on the correct design and use of baby monitors, toys and other baby products.
